The E-book lessons contain a detailed study guide, study materials and lesson plans for each age group from 5-15 years of age. The book is in Icelandic and is available online for free for teachers, parents and children.

The online handbook is made to give orientation to the parents and teachers around Iceland who have no experience teaching Catechism. They can find material and methods to teach their children easily online.


It gives a guideline for the dioceses for what the children should know in order to receive the sacraments.

It contains lesson plans, powerpoints, word documents, activities, etc. It was made from the document "Curriculum for the Catechesis of children and adolescents in the Diocese of Reykjavík" which is based on the proposal for a new curriculum of the Catholic Church in Sweden and also the Guidelines for Catechesis in the North, Nordic Bishops Conference 1982, which was translated into Icelandic in 1993.

Teaching catechism

In 2019 and 2020 I taught catechism to children who received the sacrament of confirmation.

We have made some changes and updates of the confirmation study program and tried to make it more fun and more active. Also, we were in desperate need of new material in Icelandic.



To make a long story short I made a program which is full of fun activities, games and of course the traditional Catholic preparation for confirmation.

The new confirmation program of two years I wrote is ready and we are teaching it.
